In anticipation of our next meeting, we've prepared four daily assignments. Each day, you'll read a short portion of the Bible and answer two or three questions. Since time spent in God's word is best when it is conversational (God speaks to you, you respond) we've included a prayer prompt as well.

***Day #1***

Read Deuteronomy 6:4-5

According to Jesus (see Matthew 22:36-40), what is the significance of this passage?

With which parts of ourselves are we commanded to love God?

What do you think it means *for you* to love God with all your:

- Heart

- Mind (see Matthew)
  
- Strength

Thank God for His great love for you. Ask Him to increase your love for him.

## **Day #2**

Read Deuteronomy 6:6.

What is meant by “these commandments”? How may they be summarized?

What does it mean, in a practical sense, to have something “on your heart”?

What is the connection between loving God and having his commandments on your heart?

Thank God for the gift of his commandments—for the guidance and protection they provide.

**Day #3**

Read Deuteronomy 6:7.

Rewrite this verse in your own words.

Who has made an impression on you with their love for God and His commands?

How did they do it? What would you like to imitate from that experience?

Thank God for people who have impressed you with their love for God and His Word.

Read Deuteronomy 6:7.

When are we to talk about God's commands? What is the significance of these times?

List some people you have influence on (not just your children).

What would it look like for you to impress on these people your love for God and the value of His commandments?

Thank God for the privilege of influencing people for Him. Ask Him to help you take seriously the responsibility that goes with this privilege.
