## Welcome to Jesus Changes Everything!

For the next several weeks, we'll be taking a look at women in the Gospels who encountered Jesus and whose lives were forever changed as a result. We think you will discover you have much in common with these women. And we pray that, like them, as you encounter Jesus your life will be transformed.

Our study will include three major elements. First, you will be invited to explore each woman's story for yourself. Then, you will discuss what you discovered with some friends in a small group setting. Finally, one of our teachers will share her insights with the larger group. We believe you'll get the most benefit from this study by participating in all three elements.

A few words about the "homework." Each week you will receive one Bible passage to read and a few questions to answer. The questions are in two parts:

- "What's Her Story?" focuses on understanding the woman of the week and her encounter with Jesus.
- "What's Your Story?" helps you personalize the lesson to your own situation. You will notice that the questions are identical each week. The reason for this is to develop a Bible Study Method that can be used any time you are reading about a person in the New Testament. In other words, we hope to leave this study with a skill that will be usable when we study the Bible on our own in the future. As a result of this approach, however, you may occasionally find a question that "doesn't apply" or needs to be re-phrased by you. Don't get hung up on that. Just make a note, "Doesn't apply." Or, come up with a question of your own that DOES apply and answer that. The idea is to practice thinking about these stories from the point of view of the characters themselves, and then think about how they relate to you. If you think of a question you want to explore that isn't listed in the assignment, go ahead. There's even extra space in the notebook to add pages for those thoughts. As much as possible, answer questions

In your small group you will find friends who are also exploring Jesus. Feel free to share what you are discovering and what you are struggling with. No grades will be given and there are no wrong answers or dumb questions. Your small group leader is there to facilitate the discussion, not to check and correct your answers. ©
